



CIT Regional Coordinator Opportunity

Qualifications:

- Active commissioned law enforcement officer
 - Copy of P.O.S.T. certificate is required
- Must have attended a Missouri 40-hour basic CIT Training
- Agency must be willing to allow LEO to participate
 - MOU with MO Behavioral Health Council and Department
 - Signature of Chief/Sheriff is required

Scope of Work & Pay

25-30 hours/month (average)

\$40/hour pay rate

Up to seven (7) Regional CIT Coordinator positions:

- Region 1: Northwest
- Region 2: Northeast
- Region 3: Kansas City Area
- Region 4: St. Louis Area
- Region 5: Southwest
- Region 6: Southeast
- Region 7: Central Region

The regional coordinators take direction from the Missouri Crisis Intervention Team (MO CIT) State Coordinator and will also assist the MO CIT Training Coordinator as directed.

Assist in promoting and expanding CIT across the state following the Missouri Model of CIT (see CIT One Pager) and providing consistent branding.

- Attend CISM/DEFENSE training conducted by Missouri State Highway Patrol (MSHP) within six (6) months of start date.
 - Copy of CISM/DEFENSE certificate is required upon completion
- Maintain excellent communication skills and collaborate with the MO CIT State Coordinator, MO CIT Training Coordinator, MO CIT Council Working Committee members, MO CIT Program Manager, DMH Diversion Coordinator, and Community Behavioral Health Liaisons (CBHLs).
- Assist with Strategic Planning Goals set forth by the Working Committee in each of the five sub-committees: Evaluation/Data Sharing | Expansion & Retention | Community Outreach/Marketing | Training | Officer Wellness.
- Attend statewide MO CIT Council meetings (six per year) and Working Committee meetings (monthly).
- Assist with coordination and periodically attend CIT trainings by councils located within the assigned region to ensure fidelity to the model.
- Assist in Role Play Scenarios at CIT trainings within the assigned region to provide assistance and serve as “safety” coordinator, upon request.

- Attend (in-person or virtually) local council meetings within the assigned region working with local agencies and organizations to ensure consistent growth and development and provide technical assistance, if needed.
- Provide assistance and attend the annual MO CIT Conference and leadership forum.
- Travel to and work exhibitor booths as requested to promote CIT at various conferences i.e. Missouri Sheriff's Association, Missouri Police Chief's Association, etc.
- Promote Wellness for Law Enforcement and other First Responders, which includes promoting the First Responder Provider Network (FRPN) and the Law Enforcement Wellness App.
- Promote, assist with roll out, and train on the Statewide CIT Reporting System.
- Present at meetings and trainings including topics in the 40-hour basic CIT (core and electives), Advanced, Concepts, Dispatch/Telecom, Jail, Youth, Veterans and others as needed/requested.
- Provide technical assistance to local councils within the assigned region to implement, measure, and deliver CIT best practices. [Crisis Intervention Team \(CIT\) Programs: A Best Practice Guide for Transforming Community Responses to Mental Health Crises | A Publication of CIT International](#)
- Assist with new program ideas and implementation.

Additional Considerations

The regional coordinators will be contracted positions, and will not be considered employees of Missouri Behavioral Health Council. This is a pilot approach and positions will be contracted from January 1, 2023 – June 30, 2023. A W9 must be on file for all positions prior to receiving the first payment. Taxes are not deducted from contracted employee wages and a 1099 will be sent to all contracted employees for each calendar year worked.
